
COSMORPHOLOGY: Mayterm 2012

GALLERY REVIEW GUIDELINE

As part of this course, students will be required to visit an art museum. Students will do a Field Trip Presentation including photos and commentary about what they learned during their trips and how their experience applies to their final project.

In discussing your experience at an art museum, students should address the following issues:

- Students should select a specific work or series of works from an artist that interests them.
 Works can be any scale and any media.
- Students should take an image of this work if allowed by the museum. (Images can often be obtained online if photography is prohibited).
- Student should identify the artist's name, title of the work, date created and media used.
- Students should discuss the work according to the Fundamentals of Art diagram.
 - What is the **Subject** of the work? What has inspired the artist to create the work or series of works. Most museums will have artist statements posted online or in hard copy to give students additional information.
 - What is the Form of the work? How has the artist used the Elements of Art to create their work. Are any of the Elements of Art more important than others? What materials and techniques have they used to create the piece or series. How does the artist's use of the Elements of Art and their choice of media relate to the Subject and Content of their art?
 - What is the Content of the work?
 What message or meaning is the artist trying to convey in the piece?
 - How does this relate to the artist's feelings? Do you think the artist has been successful communicating their message? Sometimes the artist's intent may not be clear, so use what you see to construct reasonable interpretations.
- Students should discuss why they selected the piece or series. Students should discuss what
 they enjoyed about the work or identify areas they feel the artist could improve upon.
 Students should discuss how this relates to their final project or process of creating their
 own works.
